

Tray and napkin

Materials

Free Spirit Life Style fabric:
Collection Deer Valley by Joel Dewberry 42"
(112 cm) wide
Tray cover
QJD3000-PERSI - amount of fabric needed
depends upon the size of the tray

Napkin

QJD2800-PEONY 20 x 20" (50 x 50 cm)

In addition matching Coats sewing thread
"Duet"

General directions

Avoid the shrinkage factor by pre-washing
all fabrics.

Tray cover

Measure length and width of tray. For 1½"
(4 cm) self-binding mitered border, add
1¾"
(4,75 cm) all the way around the perimeter.
Follow the directions below to make the
mitered corners. Place a double-sided
adhesive tape along the edges of cover to fix
in place. Advantages: The cover will not slip
but is still easy to remove for washing.

Napkin

Cut a square 18½ x 18½" (47 x 47 cm).
Follow directions below to make mitered
corners.

How to sew mitered corners

I:

Referring to diagrams use a pencil and
ruler, mark the perimeter measured on the
wrong side of fabric. Add 1¾" (4,75 cm) on
all 4 sides and cut out. Iron a ¼" (0,75 cm)
seam allowance to the wrong side.

II:

Starting at the lower right corner, fold seam
up to pencil line, place a pin to mark where
it meets on the right edge.

III:

Open seam. Fold the seam on the right side
left onto the pencil line. Insert a pin to mark
on bottom edge.

IV:

With right sides together, pull out the mitered
corner into a fold forming a triangle and
match up the pins. Start where the pins
coincide and sew a seam perpendicular to the
fold and meeting exactly where pencil lines
cross. Trim excess fabric.

V:

Press seam of mitered corner open. Repeat on
other 3 corners.

VI:

Pull binding to backside, gently poke out the
corners and sew with small blind stitches.
